Dr. Stephen Hahn: TITLE

Stephen M. Hahn, M.D., is the Chief Executive Officer and Board Chair of Nucleus RadioPharma and brings more than two decades of distinguished leadership in biotechnology, government, healthcare strategy, oncology medical practice, and translational research. He served as the 24th Commissioner of Food and Drugs at the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) from 2019 to 2021, guiding the agency through the early stages of the COVID-19 pandemic and overseeing regulatory affairs including therapeutics and vaccine development, devices, diagnostics, and clinical trials.

Prior to his FDA appointment, Dr. Hahn served as Chief Medical Executive at the world-renowned MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, where he was responsible for overseeing more than 21,000 employees and a \$5.2 billion operating budget. He has authored more than 220 peer-reviewed original



research articles focused on cancer treatment and the tumor microenvironment.

Dr. Susanna Gallani: TITLE

Susanna Gallani, Ph.D., is the Tai Family Associate Professor of Business Administration in the Accounting and Management unit at Harvard Business School, where she co-teaches the MBA elective course Transforming Health Care Delivery. She also collaborates with Harvard Medical School, co-directing the Health Care Delivery and Leadership module and teaching in postgraduate medical education programs.

Professor Gallani's research examines performance management systems and the interplay between monetary and non-monetary incentives in healthcare provider organizations. Her current work explores the role of AI in enhancing provider well-being and improving healthcare value, as well as the role of hospitals in improving health equity. Her work has been published in leading academic and healthcare journals and practitioner-oriented outlets including Harvard Business Review, Financial Times, and Forbes.
